



ST WILFRID'S EDUCATIONAL TRUST

WHO ARE WE AND WHAT IS OUR PURPOSE?

St Wilfrid's Educational Trust is a charity that was set up in the early 1990s after St Wilfrid's Church in Melling gifted the Trust a property. The property was rented for many years and the rent was used to allocate educational grants to the residents of Melling, Wrayton and Wennington. The property was sold a few years ago and the proceeds were invested with a local investment management company.

The Trustees and Committee members are local volunteers who are associated with the school, church and local community in many ways. The Trust meet twice a year and their purpose is to award Educational Grants that support individuals or group projects. One of the main beneficiaries over the years has been Melling Primary School, who have been awarded many grants towards after school clubs, school trips and equipment which benefit all pupils.

Applications are welcomed from residents who may need financial assistance towards educational related pursuits. The following lists provide examples of what can and cannot be funded.

Examples of what the Trust can fund;

- Educational or School Visit for both Primary and Secondary School Students
- Educational Material for University/ Further Education (such as topic related books)
- Adult educational training/ retraining

(such as formal online learning or adult college)

- Special Educational Needs Software Licences (such as Clicker 8 and Docsplus Literacy Software)
- Special One Off Extra-Curricular Events (such as Sporting Championships or Camps)

Examples of what the Trust Cannot Fund;

- Musical Instruments
- Uniform
- Sporting or Educational Equipment
- Regular extra-curricular lessons (such as weekly/monthly dance classes or tennis lessons)

The trust has a certain amount of funds to allocate at each meeting and their aim is to award the full amount.

The next meeting will be held on October 9th 2023 so any applications must be received before then. All applications are treated as confidential and you will receive a written reply soon after your application has been heard at the meeting. Please note that as a charity the Trust require supporting evidence that the monies awarded have been used as per the application. The Trust will require either photos or payment receipts as appropriate.

Failure to supply evidence to the trust may jeopardise any future applications.

COOKING CORNER ... PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE

FOR THE BASE

- 80g butter, melted, plus extra for the tin
- 275g digestive or ginger biscuits
- 1 large egg white (use the egg yolk in the filling, below)

FOR THE FILLING

- 800g full-fat soft cheese
- 425g can pumpkin purée
- 200g light brown soft sugar
- 50g plain flour
- 5 large eggs, plus 1 large yolk TO SERVE
- 400ml whipping cream
- ground cinnamon for dusting
- 25g pecans, chopped
- 3 tbsp caramel sauce

METHOD

1) Heat the oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Butter a deep 22cm loose-bottomed cake tin and line with baking parchment. Wrap the base and side of the tin with three layers of cling film, followed by three layers of foil (this helps keep it waterproof during baking). Fold a clean tea towel and put it in the base of a large roasting tin.

2) Blitz the biscuits to crumbs in a food processor. Add the melted butter and pulse to coat the crumbs. Tip the mixture into the prepared cake tin, spreading up to the side and pressing down with the back of a spoon. Bake for 10 mins. Remove from the oven, brush with the egg white and bake for another 3 mins (this will help stop the base from becoming soggy).

3) To make the filling, put the soft cheese



in a bowl or the bowl of a stand mixer, and beat with an electric whisk or the mixer until loosened. Add the pumpkin purée, sugar and flour and beat again until combined. With the motor running, gradually add the eggs and egg yolk until the mixture is smooth and creamy. Pour the filling over the baked biscuit base, then sit the cake tin on the tea towel in the roasting tin. Pour a kettleful of just-boiled water into the roasting tin so the water comes halfway up the side of the cake tin.

4) Bake for 10 mins, then reduce the oven temperature to 110C/90C fan/gas ¼. Bake for a further 1 hr 30 mins until the cheesecake is set with just a slight wobble in the middle when you gently shake the tin. Turn off the oven, then open the oven door slightly and leave the cheesecake to cool inside for 2 hrs until completely cool. Remove from the oven and chill overnight.

5) Carefully remove the cold cheesecake from the tin and transfer to a cake stand or serving plate. Whip the cream to soft peaks using an electric whisk, and spoon in big dollops over the cheesecake. Dust with a little cinnamon or pumpkin spice, sprinkle over the chopped pecans and drizzle with the caramel sauce before serving.
