PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Annual Parish Meeting and the AGM of the Parish Council took place on May 19th. Sandra Towers was re-elected as the Chair of the Parish Council with Andrew Stevenson being re-elected as the Vice-chair.

“OUTDOOR” MATTERS:

This includes footpaths, bridleways, gullies and the general upkeep and maintenance of Parish outdoor spaces. The “pollinator patch” on Moorside Triangle opposite the primary school is now managed by Lancaster City Council, the remit to extend the wildflower area on a permanent basis. Sadly little progress seems to have been made so far.

The PC have several new “kissing gates” to use to replace stiles which can be difficult for people and dogs to negotiate. If this is successful, we have some outstanding PROW grants which we could use to purchase more gates.

Whilst the new mowing contractor completed several very neat cuts of the Green and verges, the cuts seemed to be on a rather ad hoc basis. During the autumn and winter months it became apparent that we do need someone available to complete regular checks of gullies and grills, clear leaves and be available for sudden problems (e.g. with flooding).

The damaged tree on the Green has been inspected and has damaged branches removed. The tree surgeon appointed to carry out the tree survey has completed a mid-term update with no issues highlighted for action.

TRANSPORT:

Buses: 7 buses daily to Kirkby starting at 06.53 last bus 19.13; 9 buses to Lancaster, starting at 0627 last bus 2032.

SUSTRANS have put the Lune Cycle Route from Morecambe to Ingleton on hold and are working instead on loop footpaths so that the general public can enjoy the area without having to complete a linear route and then turn to replace steps. Due to the number of streams going into the Lune on the east side the PC feel that loop paths on the west side would be easier to construct.

Highways: Two members of the council attended a Lune Valley meeting on traffic. The speed on Lodge Lane continues to be a concern especially near the school.

Potholes remain to be a major problem, though a large amount of patching has been completed there are several which have not had work started on them, these include Lodge Lane and the A683 towards Hornby (though several have been identified and marked with white paint)

The recent heavy rain in March highlighted that although the village itself is unlikely to flood badly there are still problems opposite Town End and the access to the village near the Sheep Fold, Hornby and Station Yard is often impassable due to flooding on the main road.

Several more reports have been made about Vicar Lane following on from those made last year and just this week the Lane has been patched though the major work needed over the Old Lune seems not to have been looked at.

PLANNING:

Tree works seem to be the main reasons for planning applications, this is as a consequence of us living in a conservation area.

Lancaster City Council continues meetings for the parish councils to explain the latest updates to planning, the next being in June.

And finally, the Parish Council has purchased a laptop for the clerk's use and has now got its new website, and email for the clerk so is compliant with the new rules. It is still in its infancy, but we are on the correct track.

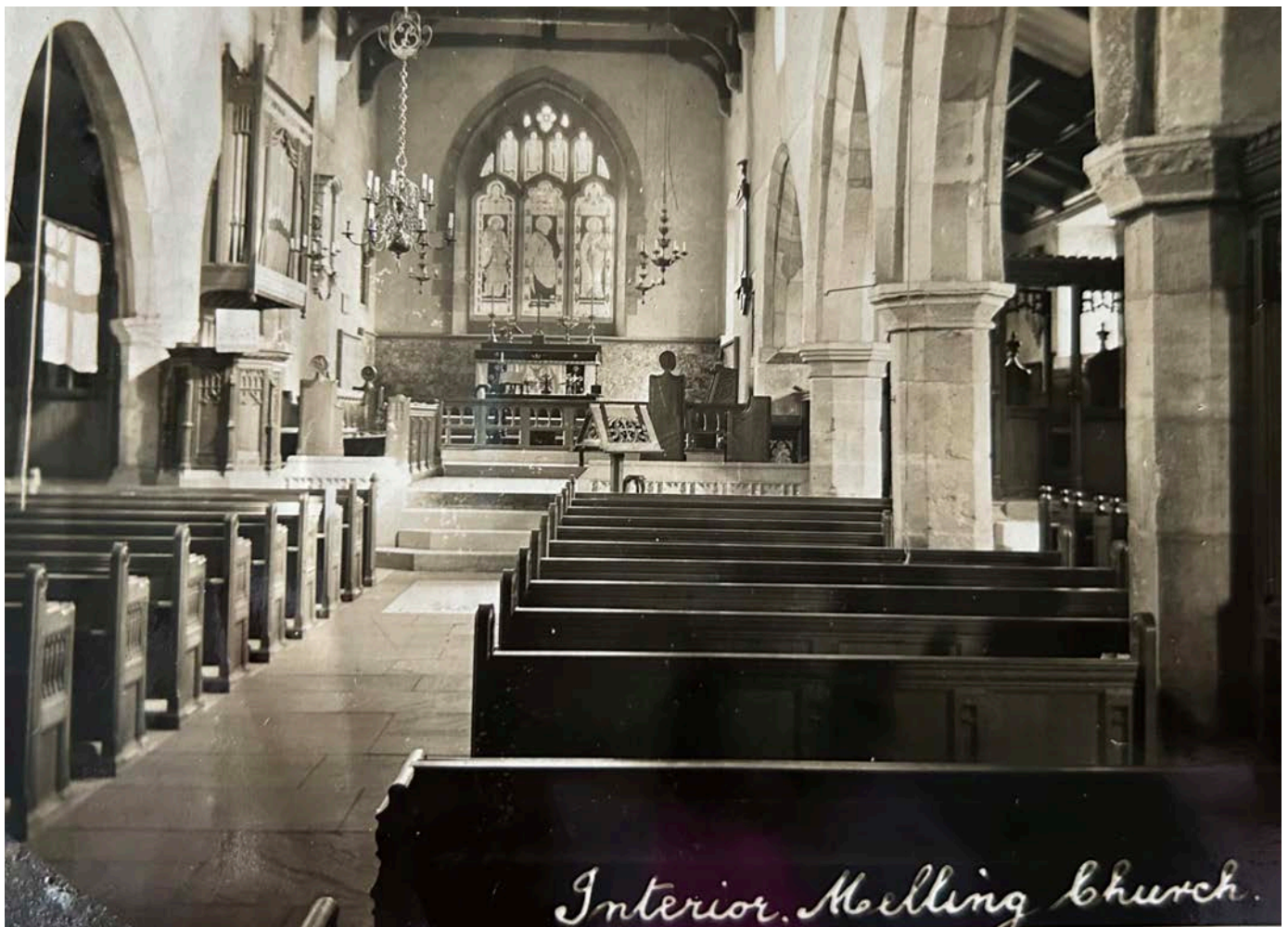

COOKING CORNER ...TURKEY MEATLOAF

INGREDIENTS

- 500g turkey mince (90% to 92% lean)
- 225g button mushrooms, trimmed and very finely chopped
- 1 medium onion, peeled and finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, peeled and crushed
- 1 tablespoon oil
- ¾ teaspoon fine sea salt
- ½ teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 7 tablespoons ketchup
- 60g panko or homemade breadcrumbs
- 80ml milk
- 2 large eggs, lightly beaten



METHOD

- 1) Preheat the oven to 200°C. Lightly oil a rimmed baking sheet or 9-inch by 13-inch baking pan lined with aluminium foil.
- 2) Heat oil in a large frying pan over medium-low heat. Add the onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened; about 5 minutes. Add the garlic and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute. Stir in the mushrooms, 1/2 teaspoon salt, and 1/4 teaspoon pepper. Cook until the mushrooms give off their liquid and it boils away, about 10 minutes.
- 3) Transfer the onions and mushrooms to a large bowl and then stir in the Worcestershire sauce and 3 tablespoons of the ketchup. Set aside to cool for 5 minutes.
- 4) Combine the breadcrumbs and milk in a small bowl. Stir the breadcrumb mixture and the eggs into the mushrooms and onions. Using a fork or your hands, gently mix in the ground turkey, ¼ teaspoon salt, and ¼ teaspoon pepper. The mixture will be very wet.
- 5) Form the meatloaf into a 20 cm by 10 cm oval in the middle of the prepared baking sheet. Spread the remaining 4 tablespoons of ketchup on top.
- 6) Bake in the preheated oven for about 50 minutes or until thermometer inserted into the thickest part of the meatloaf registers 80°C. Let the meatloaf rest for 10 minutes before slicing.

LUNESDALE PROBUS CLUB

In some ways we live in strange times: one of the wealthiest nations on earth, yet with many families relying on foodbanks; vast numbers of shiny and expensive motor cars and roads scarred by potholes; a land of great beauty, cherished by all, but with rivers polluted by raw sewage.

These thoughts came to my mind as I was looking at the topic of our first speaker in June. Most of the world is not so fortunate as us though. David Gardiner will be addressing us on the work of WaterAid, the organisation dedicated to helping the improvement of clean water supplies in the third world. Despite the present scandal of corporate greed and near criminal behaviour by our water companies, we take the provision of plentiful and safe water for granted: would that the same could be true elsewhere! Thanks to the work of this charity, the goal of safe water for all comes closer. A fascinating subject and one which I am sure many will wish to hear about. **David's talk** is on **June 1st** at our usual time and place. Friends, family, guests and visitors are always welcome.

On a completely different note, on **June 15th**, **Mike Winstanley**, who has talked to us previously on Muck, Medicine and Mortality, will take us Away From It All with a look at the rise of the English seaside holiday resort in the nineteenth century. There can be few things more central to our popular culture than all the images that the thought of holidays by the sea bring to mind: donkey rides, ice creams, squealing teens on rollercoasters, comically vulgar postcards, knotted handkerchief hats.
