#### ST. WILFRID'S CHURCH

We hope that you will have had a good Easter and may have had the opportunity to come to one of the church services held during this Christian festival.

As with many organisations, a church can only be sustainable with the active support of people within the community. Over the past 3 years, since the appointment of Reverend Jane, a range of services has been introduced at St. Wilfrid's in Melling, in our combined Parish of Tunstall, Melling and Leck and in the wider Benefice.

In addition to Morning Service (on the first Sunday of each month) and Holy Communion (on the third Sunday) at St Wilfrid's, Rev Jane says Morning Prayer on week days, rotating across the 6 churches.

Shorter services, designed specifically for young children and families, such as: Sunday@4, Messy Church and Wild Church: are held throughout the Benefice. **Encounter:** is a more informal service, held at Leck on the third Sunday evening of each month.

**Youth Groups:** for 10-14 year olds, are held monthly in Wray and Leck churches. The aim is to offer a wide variety of services and opportunities to meet.





#### **COOKING CORNER ... A SPECIAL BREAKFAST!:**

## ASPARAGUS WITH SMOKED SALMON, POACHED EGG AND HOLLANDAISE SAUCE

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 500g asparagus spears, ends trimmed
- 200g baby leaf spinach
- ½ tbsp vegetable oil
- 1 tbsp white wine vinegar
- 4 fresh medium eggs
- 120g mild smoked salmon
- 4 tbsp hollandaise sauce

#### **METHOD**

1) Bring a pan of water to the boil. Simmer the asparagus for 2 minutes, then drain and plunge into a bowl of cold water to stop it cooking any further.



- 1) Wilt the spinach with a splash of water in a large pan, then leave to drain over a sieve to remove any excess liquid off
- 2) Heat the oil in a wide griddle pan and cook the asparagus spears for 3-minutes, until there are dark golden griddle marks all over. Keep warm.
- 3) Bring another, large, pan of water to the boil, add the vinegar. Crack an egg into a small bowl or ramekin. Using a slotted spoon, swirl the water so that a whirlpool forms, then carefully pour the egg into the water. Cook for 3 minutes, then remove with a slotted spoon and drain on kitchen paper.
- 4) Repeat with the remaining 3 eggs.
- **5)** Divide the asparagus between 4 plates, then top with the spinach, poached egg, smoked salmon and hollandaise sauce.

#### LUNESDALE PROBUS CLUB

As I write this, the lovely spell of fine weather has broken and rain is running down the windows, children's holidays are being spoilt, an economic dispute between the two great powers is causing shock waves around the stock markets of the world. Worrying times at many levels! But all this pales into insignificance compared to the impact of the Great War, raging across the globe but particularly in Europe a hundred or so years ago!

Anne- Marie Michel's talk to us on the impact of that war on Art and Artists brought home to all of us just how wide reaching the effects of that conflict were and remain to this day. It was perhaps the artists who were the first to see that this war was radically different, that no longer could war be portrayed as glorious and heroic, that the reality was cruel, brutal, merciless. and degrading. Despite having their works censored by the government, they continued to record with merciless clarity the true nature of modern industrialised warfare. Even artists such as John Singer Sargent, darling of the wealthy for his society portraits, were affected as his powerful Gassed Soldiers shows. Nobody at our meeting can not have been moved by that painting. The freshness of the images, now a century or more old was astonishing and a powerful reminder in these uncertain times, filled with conflicts around the earth, that sadly we have learned nothing and that the War to end Wars was alas anything but.

Bank holidays interrupt our schedule so our next meeting is not till May 19th when we will be adressed by an old friend Bernard Thompson on the submarine war in the Atlantic during the Second World War: hmm!

As ever, all welcome to our meetings at the Institute in Hornby, 10am for coffee and biscuits, 10.30am for the meeting.
