ACCIDENT IN MELLING!

Although there was a lot of concern and disturbance in the village on the 16th September when a road traffic accident occurred around midday between a car and a motorcycle on the A683 in the middle of the village. Fortunately it was a low speed collision and no serious injuries were sustained, the motorcyclist was air-lifted to hospital as a precaution and the car driver was taken to hospital by ambulance due to the shock he had suffered.

A passing doctor and another motorcyclist were on the scene very quickly as were a number of residents who helped until the ambulances and police arrived.

Quite unusually the car had hit the motorcycle from behind and the motorcyclist was thrown clear landing in the driveway of The Old Malt House. The motorcycle became wedged under the car and it took around 3 hours to clear the wreckage.

MARIE JOSEPHINE BAKER "A LIFE LIVED TO THE FULL"



Marie was born on September 28th 1951 in Old Hill, the Heart of the Black Country, close to Birmingham. Her father was a mechanical engineer and Marie would often help him at his workplace packing boxes with nuts and bolts. She had two brothers, John older, and Mark younger than her. They shared a very happy childhood. Holidays were especially enjoyable, travelling with their parents around Europe on a limited budget, which meant a lot of camping.

Instead of taking the expected secretarial path Marie decided early on that her career should be in education. After attending Newman College, close to home, for teacher training. Marie moved to Stoke Newington, London in 1973 to start her career in teaching.

It was there at a party, that she met Stewart. In 1975 Marie moved to Dunstable, Bedfordshire and on a very hot day in July 1976 Marie and Stewart were married, moving into their first house shortly after.

Marie's first job was teaching Geography and Mathematics at Icknield High School, Luton; the area had a significant number of pupils from ethnic backgrounds and Marie thrived in this challenging environment, gaining a reputation of being able to defuse even the most awkward situations. Icknield High School was the springboard for future career success.

Marie gained a Degree in Geography/Geology in 1983 and a Masters Degree from Oxford Brooks in 1993. She became Deputy Head of Denbigh High School, Luton, with her first Headship at Houghton Regis Upper School following 3 years later. Her successes at Houghton Regis lead to Marie being invited to apply for the Headship at Sandy Upper School, East Bedfordshire. At Sandy Marie steered the school back to success and restored its' position of pride within the community following the hard times the school had fallen upon due to poor OFSTED Reports. She obtained multi-million pound funding for an on-site community sports centre and top class running track. This involved negotiation at Government level.

Despite having demanding careers Marie and Stewart moved house twice. Both times within Bedfordshire before finally settling down (or so they thought) in Aspley Heath, next to the Woburn Estate.

Marie had a very happy and fulfilled working life, and in 2007, she decided to retire to enjoy her allotment and her new hobby of patchwork and embroidery.

Not content with just tending a single piece of ground, expansion took over and Marie finished up with 3 allotment plots, which in addition to providing fruit and vegetables for the table also gained awards in competitions.

She was instrumental in setting up a very successful embroidery group in Milton Keynes (MKGEMS) where liked minded ladies explored all aspects of machine sewing, from basic to very advanced projects. Marie was also member of The Institute of Advance Motorists. Marie was very supportive of Stewart and his hobbies (Amateur Radio & Flying); she was Stewart's first passenger after he qualified for his Private Pilot's Licence!

Freed from the constraints of school holidays Marie and Stewart travelled widely, with frequent trips round Europe, and to the States, one of their last holidays was an Alaskan cruise.

The move to Melling in 2014 was a calculated risk for Marie and Stewart and one they never regretted, they were welcomed into the community and made many new friends. Marie became the editor of the Melling Chronicle for a few years from 2015 until 2019 which allowed her to meet even more people. She joined the Thursday Group and the Patchwork Group and became involved with the Church and Village Institute. She refused to join committees of any description, though, saying she'd had enough of those to last her a lifetime.

Much to her irritation, Marie was diagnosed with cancer in June 2019. It was overwhelming and scary at first, added to eight months later, by all the COVID restrictions and issues.

With the loving support of Stewart, her brother Mark and sister-in-law Elaine,

and the many old and new friends she did her best to put up a stubborn fight for just over two years; her view was "there can't be many other people you would prefer to be with or places you would rather be" under such circumstances.

Marie was always grateful for the level of support she received from everyone near and far and would have wished for her thanks to be passed to everyone concerned for helping her get through with their kindness, friendship and comforting words.

Marie died on July 26th 2021 in St John's Hospice, her ashes were interred in September at Dalton Woodland Burial Ground.

Marie will be missed by so many people, not least of all - by me... Stewart Baker

Very soon after arriving in Melling, Marie became the Editor of the Melling Chronicle. Thanks to Marie's commitment and organising skills, the content and production of the Chronicle were given a new life. Readers appreciated the clear and attractive layout, including the photos, some of which were taken by Marie herself. A monthly diary of events on the front page gave residents no excuse for not knowing what was on locally, in the school, church and Village Hall. Marie was also instrumental in collecting and cataloging a wealth of documents and photos covering nearly a hundred years of parish history; these documents form a valuable part of the parish archive. The Parish Council remembers Marie's contribution to the 21st-century life of the parish with gratitude. David Nott

I recently met up with Stewart to talk through what should be written in the Chronicle about Marie, he brought a copy of a letter that he had opened the evening before. It was a letter to Marie from and ex-student, telling her about her family, her COVID experience as a front-line heath worker and thanking Marie once again for her time patience and friendship to her when she was a troubled teenager. Marie was a special lady, generous of her time and skills as a needlewoman. Melling and Tatham churches have stunning evidence of that in their altar cloths. Sandra Towers

COOKING CORNER... BLACKBERRY AND APPLE CRUMBLE MUFFINS

INGREDIENTS

- 300g plain flour, plus extra for dusting
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- Pinch of salt
- 190g caster sugar
- 210ml milk
- 1 large free-range egg, beaten
- 100g butter, melted
- Finely grated zest of 1 large lemon
- 250g (1 large) Bramley apple
- 150g blackberries

FOR THE CRUMBLE TOPPING

- 15g butter, at room temperature
- 25g plain flour
- 15g demerara sugar



Why not try them for pudding, breakfast or a mid-afternoon snack with a cup of tea!

METHOD

1. Preheat the oven to 200°C/fan180°C/gas 6 and line a 12-hole muffin tray with paper muffin cases.

2. First, make the crumble topping. Rub the butter into the flour until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar and work the mixture with your fingers until it forms nuggets.

3. For the muffins, sift the flour, baking powder and salt into a mixing bowl and stir in the sugar. In another smaller bowl, beat the milk with the egg, melted butter and lemon zest.

4. Peel, quarter and core the apple, and cut into blackberry-size pieces.

5. Stir the wet mixture into the flour and sugar mixture until combined. (It's fine if it's still a bit lumpy.) Stir in the apple and blackberries.

6. Spoon the mixture evenly into the paper cases and sprinkle over the crumble topping. Bake for 20-25 minutes until risen and golden. Cool for 5 minutes, then serve warm.

For a change add 25g of chopped nuts such as pecans or walnuts to the crumble topping.



The Club has now held 2 face to face meetings meetings since Covid restrictions have been eased and will try to continue using a hybrid combination until all members are happy to attend face to face meetings. It was so good to meet up with friends and to enjoy the

fellowship which is synonymous among Rotarians.

I have mentioned in a previous newsletter that Rotary has adopted a 7th area of focus which all about caring for and protecting our environment. At long last governments of the world are waking up to the need to do this. Many of you will have seen on TV the devastating floods in New York recently and watched the damage they created in so many ways to lives and property. The really terrifying aspect of the floods was the speed at which they occurred. Bearing in mind the environmental changes occurring around the globe you may wish to attend the event plus there will be an opportunity to ask questions of experts.

Dear Councillor

The environment initiative has been adopted by Rotary International with Rotary in Great Britain and Ireland as their seventh (or new) "Area of Focus" and the Rotary Club of Lunesdale believes that it can achieve most by encouraging people in the Lune Valley and surrounding area to take action themselves to mitigate global warming, rather than just waiting for the Government to take action.

This will form one of the first external events in the "Cop 26 at Lancaster Festival" week, leading up to the Cop 26 summit in Glasgow, so the timing is very appropriate.

I am sending this preliminary notice to all Parish Councils in our area, together with other interested organisations, in the hope that you will want to encourage your members to come to the meeting, and to become involved - entry will be on a first come first served basis, but it would be helpful if you send me an email on martinandaltheagillibrand@gmail.com to give us an idea of numbers.






These will continue to be held in the Institute at 7pm on Saturdays, beginning on **2nd**
