

SPRING - JUST AROUND THE CORNER



The arrival of crocuses in the churchyard last month was an opportunity to reflect on the impact individuals can have on a community.

With the beauty of these flowers marking the beginning of Spring my mind turned back to the time when they were planted by June Fawcett who played such a significant part in the life of the church and our community over many years, until she moved to St Albans to be nearer to her family.

I sent a photo of them to her eldest daughter Diana along with our best wishes. She was kind enough to reply with this lovely photo of June having afternoon tea and sent this to share with us all in the Chronicle.

"We moved to Melling in 1966 and so by the time Mum moved to St Albans she had lived in the village for 55 years, in three different houses and was closely involved in the life of the village and the church for all that time.

Although her flat is completely different to anywhere she has ever lived before she has adapted with her characteristic enthusiasm and good humour. She remains fit, walking most days and gardening when the weather is fine. She looks out onto lovely shared gardens which give her great pleasure.



She doesn't remember much in the moment now, but talks fondly of Melling and the Church often. Dad sadly died in 1983 and is buried in the churchyard. It is lovely to think of the bulbs she planted being a reminder of their life in the village."

I was privileged to grow up alongside the Fawcett children and also their dad Harry (our vicar) and his wife June.

You may be interested to know that the South Gate to the churchyard bears the initials WHCF - William Henry Carr Fawcett - in his memory and the crocuses behind them happy memories of June's love of the natural world and of St Wilfrid's Church.

People make places - and it is lovely to remember.

UP & RUNNING AGAIN

LUNESDALE ARTS TRAIL, JUNE 24/25TH & JULY 1ST & 2ND.

After 2 years closed for Covid and a further year against risk, the Lunesdale Arts (Studio) Trail is up and running again this summer. There will be ten artists' studios open for you to explore, with a variety of exciting work on display.

What is more: it is free. Work will be for sale and the artists will be on hand to discuss it with you.

One attractive aspect is the wide variety of work to see in all sorts of media. There will be sculpture: metal animal pieces by Andy Kay, who is seen regularly in Country Life. You will see textiles, prints and drawings, and of course paintings in oils, watercolours, etc, as well as pastels. Even a new film!

The studios are set in all sorts of places, buildings and environments: converted barns, Victorian school buildings, houses and farms, in street, garden or landscape. Some are historic in themselves. One is set in a much-televised garden- (extra fee for wandering in that)- which is the subject of the film.

The art work itself is quite different in the various studios. Some is based on our lovely local landscape. Some is more abstract including constructions. One is based around concern for biodiversity, another specialises in closely painted pictures of wild and farm creatures. You can find your favourites via the brochure.

There will be road signs to the studios from Farleton, in the villages and at road

junctions. When you arrive at your first visit you will find waiting for you a brochure with a map and a list of all artists for you to visit. Starting in Bentham you can make your way first to the studio/home of Ton and June Roberts at the bottom of Robin Lane. In Tatham, Peter Osborne, David and Hannah Davies, John Hatton and Mike Barlow can set you on your way. At Burton there is Terry Hurd.

The main studio trail openings are in June, Sat/Sun 24th/25th, and in July, Sat/Sun 1st and 2nd. Make sure they are in your diary.

DOG FOULING

Recently the Parish Council has had several complaints about dog mess. With the main problem areas being the access road to the Moor and the path which leads to the Churchyard. Several complaints have come from householders' who have found dog mess on their own, private drives, and they do not own a dog!

"DOG MESS IS THE MOST UNACCEPTABLE AND OFFENSIVE TYPE OF LITTER ON OUR STREETS. OUR RESEARCH TELLS US THAT DOG FOULING IS THE ISSUE THE PUBLIC ARE MOST CONCERNED ABOUT." —KEEP BRITAIN TIDY.

- Under the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act, it is an offence not to clean up after a dog has defecated on public land.
- A person may be issued with an £80 fixed penalty fine, if they do not clean up, or alternatively may be prosecuted through the magistrates' court, where the maximum fine is £1000.



- If you see someone out with their dog who fails to clear up you can report them via the link on: www.lancaster.gov.uk/ environmental-health/dog-warden-service/dog-fouling
- When out with your dog you should always be prepared to clean up after it.
- Dog waste bags are easily carried and readily available

from Lancaster and Morecambe Visitor Information Centres and from most pet stores and vets. Plastic carrier bags can be re-used for the same purpose.

- Dog waste that has been bagged can be disposed of in any ordinary litter bin or dog waste bin.
- There are bins on the entrance to the Moor, by the School, by the post box (Gillison Close), near the Village Hall, or the waste can be taken home and placed in your grey wheelie bin.

Your dog can't clean up after itself, it's up to you!

VOTING—YOU WILL NEED ID

From 4 May 2023 you'll need to show photo ID when voting in person in some UK elections or referendums. You'll need it to vote in:

- UK Parliament by-elections
- Local elections in England (including councils, mayors, the Greater London Authority and parishes) recall of MP petitions in England, Scotland and Wales
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections in England and Wales
- Neighbourhood planning referendums and Business Improvement District referendums in England
- Local authority referendums in England (including Council Tax increase referendums)

Check if you have accepted photo ID - you'll need one of the following types of photo ID to vote:

- a UK or Northern Ireland photocard driving licence (full or provisional)
- a driving licence issued by the EU, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, the Isle of Man or any
 of the Channel Islands
- a UK passport
- a passport issued by the EU, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein or a Commonwealth country
- a PASS card (National Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- a Blue Badge
- a biometric residence permit (BRP)
- a Defence Identity Card (MOD form 90)
- a national identity card issued by the EU, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein
- a Northern Ireland Electoral Identity Card
- a Voter Authority Certificate
- an Anonymous Elector's Document

You can also use one of the following travel passes as photo ID when you vote:

- an older person's bus pass
- a disabled person's bus pass
- an Oyster 60+ card
- a Freedom Pass
- a Scottish National Entitlement Card (NEC)
- a 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- a Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- a Northern Ireland concessionary travel pass

The photo on your ID must look like you. You can still use your ID even if it has expired.

If you're voting as someone's proxy: You'll need to take your own ID when you go to vote on someone else's behalf. You do not need to take theirs.

If you've changed your name: The name on your ID must match your name on the electoral register. If it does not, you'll need to either: register to vote again with your

new details; take a document with you to vote that proves you've changed your name (for example, a marriage certificate). Small differences do not matter. For example, if your ID says 'Jim Smith' instead of 'James Smith'.

If you do not have a type of photo ID that allows you to vote, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate or apply for a postal vote.

COOKING CORNER ... ONE-PAN HERBY ROAST LAMB WITH LEMON

INGREDIENTS

- 2kg leg of lamb
- 1 garlic bulb (about 10 cloves)
- small bunch of mint
- small bunch of parsley
- 2 large rosemary sprigs, needles picked
- 1 lemon, zested and thinly sliced
- 1 preserved lemon, peel cut into quarters, flesh and pips discarded (or use 1 heaped tsp preserved lemon paste)
- 70ml olive oil
- 1kg floury potatoes (such as Maris Piper or King Edward), halved or quartered if large
- 1 tbsp harissa paste
- 200g thick Greek yogurt
- 200g feta cheese, crumbled steamed peas or spring greens, to serve



- 1) Take the lamb out of the fridge at least 1 hr before cooking to come to room temperature. Score the skin into 3cm diamonds using a sharp knife, don't cut too deep.
- 2) Cut the garlic bulb in half to expose the flesh of each clove. Set one half aside, then pop the cloves from the remaining half out of their skins. Put these in a small food processor along with most of the mint and parsley, the rosemary, lemon zest, preserved lemon and a large pinch of salt. Blitz the mixture together, or pound using a pestle and mortar, adding half the olive oil once the herbs have started to break down. Pour the marinade over the lamb, massaging it into the cuts. Marinate at room temperature for at least 30 mins, or chill for up to 24 hrs.
- 3) Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Put the lamb in your largest roasting tin (you'll need space to add the potatoes later). Wrap well with foil and bake for 45 mins.
- 4) Put the potatoes in a large pan of cold salted water. Set over a medium heat and bring to the boil, then reduce the heat and simmer for 5 mins. Drain and leave to steam-dry for 10 mins.
- 5) Remove the lamb from the oven and lift onto a board. Drizzle the remaining oil into the roasting tin, then tip in the potatoes, fresh lemon slices and the remaining garlic bulb half, rubbing the cut side in the oil. Season and toss to coat the.....(continued...)



potatoes and lemon slices in the oil and lamb juices. Sit the lamb on top.

- 6) Return to the oven for 35 mins more for medium (a thermometer should read 55C), or 50 mins for well done. Transfer the lamb to a warm platter, cover and leave to rest. Meanwhile, shake the potatoes around in the tin and return to the oven for another 20-25 mins, or until golden and crisp. Swirl the harissa paste through the yogurt.
- 7) Roughly chop the remaining mint and parsley. Scatter herbs and feta over the potatoes. Carve the lamb and pour any roasting juices into the spiced yogurt, and mix through. Serve the lamb and potatoes with peas or spring greens, and the spiced yogurt sauce on the side for drizzling over.



THE ROTARY CLUB OF LUNESDALE



It is good to have started holding meetings regularly again at The Highwayman in Burrow (as we did before the Covid pandemic) where Club members can enjoy a drink, a meal and catch-up with fellow Rotarians.

I can report once again that we have enjoyed some really good talks in the past month. Ron Nelson gave an excellent talk about the Barrow in Furness shipyard. Some of the most notable vessels built there include the Royal Navy flagship HMS Albion and the former flagships HMS Bulwark and HMS Invincible sometimes referred to as the Pride of Barrow.

On 23rd February Mike Willets, of the Rotary Club of Carnforth, gave a talk about the school which he founded in Kitale, Uganda in 2005. Great things have been achieved with this project of his since then with some of the students aiming for and achieving university entrance. Duncan Hamlett and myself visited the school in 2014 and were most impressed with the opportunities and achievements we saw.

On 2nd March Dr Simon Kaye and his wife Pauline gave a joint presentation about the charity they support "Children of Hope". Money raised for this charity is used to establish an education fund for young Ugandans to obtain qualifications in healthcare which ultimately will benefit their own communities.

On 9th March our meeting was cancelled because of freezing weather and dangerous road conditions. That was a first!
