

MELLING VILLAGE HALL ROOF REPAIRS

There were few good things about Covid-19 but one unexpected benefit was

government grants for village halls. We have Adrian Francis to thank for spotting these and making timely applications. Whilst bigger halls found their grants quickly swallowed up by overheads, the management committee at Melling Village Hall have long been used to running on a shoestring. This meant we had money to spare and it couldn't have come at a better time.



The rotten timbers!

The leaking roof over the kitchen was long overdue for replacement. Over the years, former long-serving committee member John Lowery had volunteered his time to make repairs to the barge boards and soffits, often providing the materials as well. However, recent storms had displaced some slates and areas of timberwork were now beyond patching. With fine weather in May, Alpha Roofing were able to completely strip the roof, revealing more hidden decay. The old timberwork was stripped out and new joists fitted where needed, along with all new barge boards and soffits. All the outer timberwork was replaced with Accoya, which has a 50 year above ground rot guarantee. This modified wood is sustainably sourced with FSC® certification and has minimal environmental impact throughout its entire life.

The valley gutters between the kitchen and the main roof were also well past their intended life, so all new leadwork was installed. The roof lacked felt and the pargetting had mostly fallen off the underside, so the best new breathable felt was fitted, which prevents condensation which can occur with bitumen felt.

Many of the original slates were dressed and reused, with the addition of a quantity of carefully matched reclaimed ones. The old slate nails were galvanised, which rot - these were replaced by copper with a much longer life but are four times the price! An unexpected problem we found was that the ridge tiles were the wrong pitch, leaving the slate nails underneath exposed - each a potential leak, so they too were replaced.

The total cost was just over £7,500 (far more than the hall's pre-Covid cash reserves). The end result is a high quality new roof restored to its original appearance. With a bit of luck it will be good from another hundred years. Now the roof is sound, we just have to tackle the rising damp!





COOKING CORNER ... CINNAMON TOFFEE APPLE WEDGES

INGREDIENTS

- 100g butter
- 100g golden caster sugar
- 6 apples, cored and cut into wedges
- ½ tsp ground cinnamon
- Handful pecans, toasted and chopped

METHOD

Heat the butter and sugar in a pan set over the fire or a medium heat. As it begins to bubble and turn golden brown, add the apples and cinnamon and cook for 5 minutes, turning to coat the apples in the toffee mix.

Stir in the pecans. Serve immediately with giant chocolate cookies and ice cream.
