NEWS FROM ST. WILFRID'S CHURCH

We hope that the meeting will be well supported.

As part of the Diocesan Centenary celebrations, we will continue to celebrate the cultural and historic importance of St. Wilfrid's Church Melling by holding **'A Heritage Day with a difference!'** on **Saturday 12th September from 11am-3pm** with displays in the church, talks, refreshments and the first public screening of a new film in Melling Institute.

THE DAY WILL INCLUDE

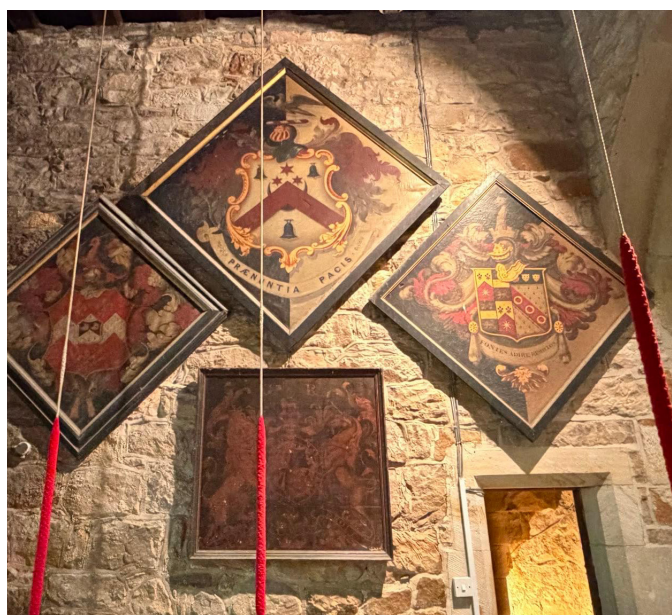
- **Bellringing and Heritage displays**, including a special feature on the life of the remarkable Catholic Anne Fenwick, whose tomb is in the church.
- At 11:30am **"The miraculous discovery of the gold coins"** - a short talk by the Rev. Jane Lee.
- At 1pm in Melling Institute **"Echoes Through Time: West Gallery Music and the two Pipe Organs of Melling Church"** - an illustrated talk by Hugh Smith, followed by a tour of the organ and some playing of this wonderful instrument.
- In the Institute, throughout the day, the first public screening of the film **"A fly-through tour of St. Wilfrid's"**, where you can see the church from both familiar and inaccessible viewpoints, using drone footage.
- **Refreshments** will be available in the Institute throughout the day - (if you can help with serving refreshments or provide cakes, please contact Sue Flowers at sue@greenclose.org).

This event will be followed by an online presentation on **Monday 14th September at 7pm** entitled **"The Early History of Melling"**. This will be a repeat of the illustrated

talk given in June, for those who may have missed it or want to hear it again. The talk can be accessed via Zoom - meeting ID 8304395 2912, passcode 439920.

All proceeds from the events will go to St. Wilfrid's Building Trust to fund the much needed repairs to the fabric of the building. We hope that the money raised, along with donations received from the other events, will be able to provide match-funding for grants.

COOKING CORNER ... PLUM CAKE

INGREDIENTS:

- butter for greasing
- 2 tbsp demerara sugar
- 500g plums
- For the cake
- 175g butter
- 175g dark muscovado sugar
- 140g golden syrup
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 200ml milk
- 300g self-raising flour
- ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 1 tbsp ground ginger
- 1 tsp mixed spice



METHOD

1. Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Grease and line the base of a 23cm (9") square cake tin with baking parchment. Butter the paper generously and sprinkle with the demerara sugar. Halve the plums, remove the stones and arrange in the base of the tin in one layer, cut-sides down.

2. For the cake, melt the butter, muscovado sugar and syrup in a large pan over a low heat, stirring until smooth. Cool for 10 mins, then stir in the eggs and milk. Sift in the flour, bicarbonate of soda and spices, then mix to a smooth batter.

3. Pour the batter into the tin, over the plums, and bake for 45-55 mins until firm to the touch. Cool in the tin for 10 mins, then turn out onto a wire rack and leave to cool. Will keep in the fridge, wrapped in baking parchment and foil, for up to 5 days.

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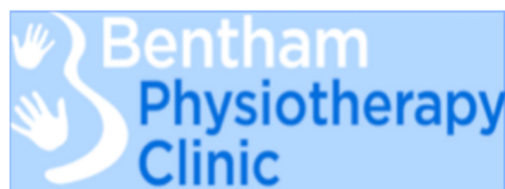

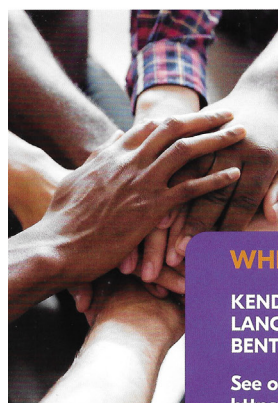
